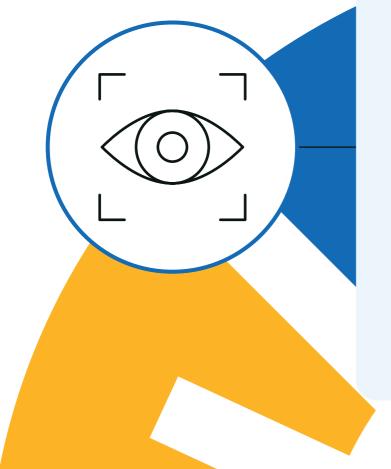

Together, we transform lives by delivering healthier tomorrows through excellence in patient-centred care across community, inpatient and custodial settings.

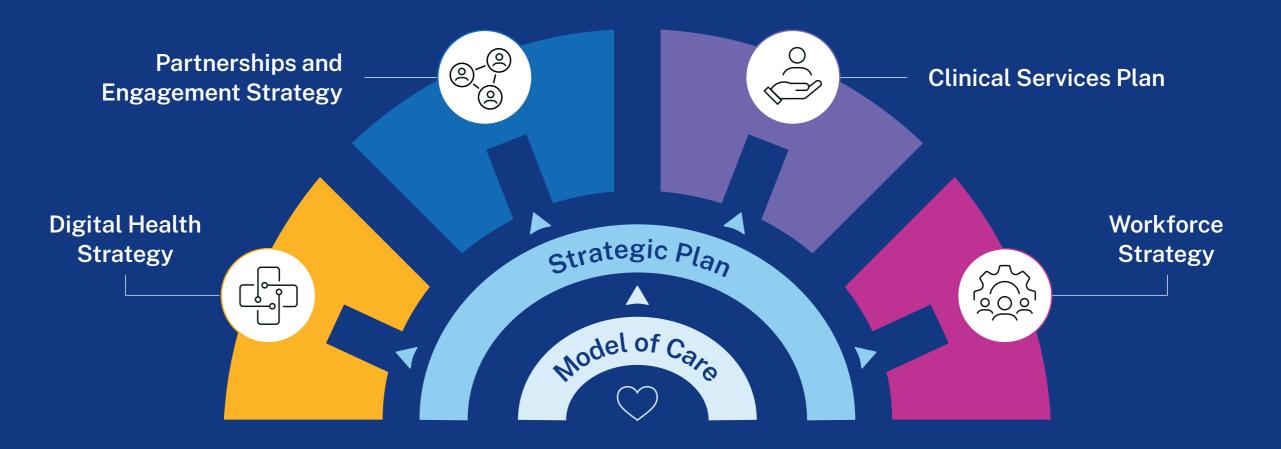

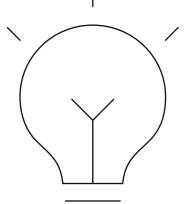

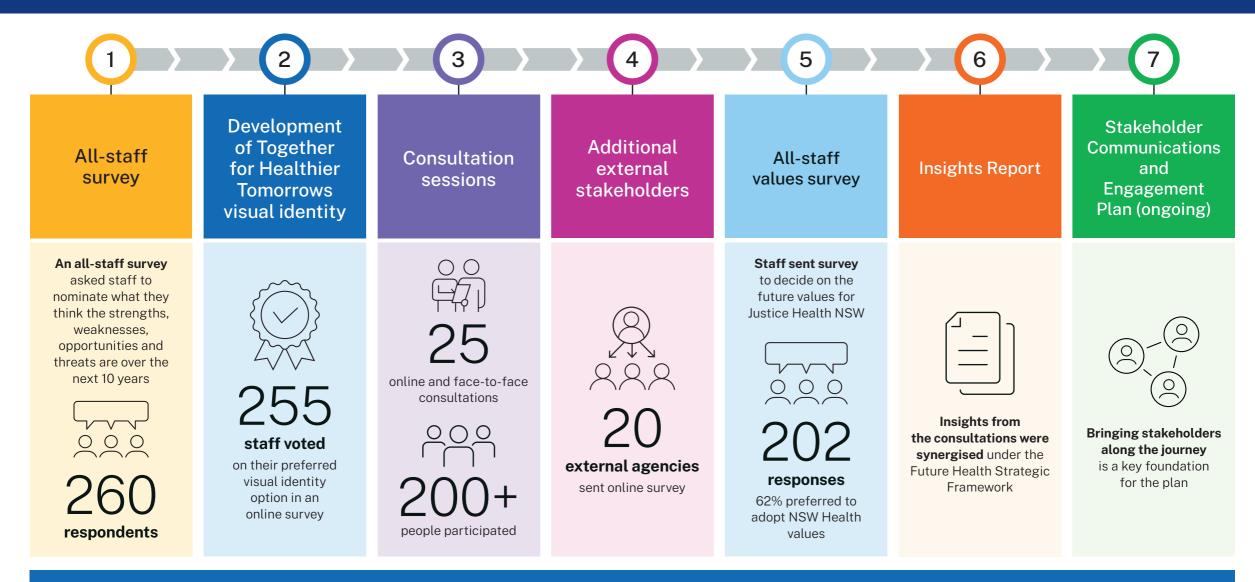
